PASTOR'S MESSAGE

FOOD FOR THOUGHT....a note from your Pastor

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. ²Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect. Romans 12

A member recently sent me a letter where they described a conversation amongst a group of church goers discussing "important things" regarding church. (not Immanuel, but could there be some similarities?) The conversation ranged from who was going to mow the grass in the cemetery, how much would new cupboards for the kitchen cost, allowing artificial flowers, all the way to whether the new hymnal was liked by anyone and what kind of polish to use on the furniture. The author of this letter then posed the question, what if we were having conversations similar to these and Jesus showed up and said, "What are you discussing? I'd love to join in the conversation."

Do you think Jesus would just jump in weigh in on these topics? Would Jesus deem these questions as of primary importance to the mission of the body of Christ? Or would Jesus remind us that worship is meant for honoring, praising and thanking God for what God has done. Would Jesus redirect our attention away from these *little* things to the greater vision of sharing the message of hope and salvation of His life, death and resurrection with everyone and that the church is called to be His body on earth? What "church matters" do you think Jesus would say are most important?

Although these matters might be of some import, they are not *vital*. I believe it is easy for us to forget what is vitally important. Being human, our tendency is to fall back into what is familiar and comfortable; what is traditional and stirs old warm emotions. We look back with fondness and we dream about how things were and how we could be in that place again or feel the way we did. It is called nostalgia and we all have it at one time or another, to one degree or another. But the issue with nostalgia is that it is impossible to travel back in time. As much as we might like to, we cannot. And recreating that experience is next to impossible; maintaining it for any length of time, even more impossible. Ever been to Mackinaw Island when they are repairing roads? See what I mean?

The fact is that we are moving forward in time; we cannot go back, we cannot freeze it in the moment, our only choice is to **move forward**. How shall we move forward as a body of Christ known as Immanuel, with God's calling at the forefront? In response to this

question, we are commissioning a **focus group** to address changes in our worship and Christian Education. It is no secret that in a few short years we will experience a deficiency of young people. Although we have had a number of families visit, we, like many other mainline churches, are shrinking. So, what can we do with our worship and education structure that will be more attractive and welcoming to families with children?

This is primary vital question that will be placed before this focus group. This group will examine and research numerous possibilities and then put forth a recommendation based on their findings. They will focus mostly on worship times and styles, family schedules, methods of outreach and areas of growth. This will be an honest, sometimes tough look at our church body, but again, with the goal of furthering the Gospel and sharing a message of hope with generations to come. For us who are nostalgic, we may find it painful or upsetting. For those who wish to see God's kingdom outreach grow through this community of faith, it will be challenging.

This focus group will begin as soon as possible. It will consist of 5-7 people from the congregation and will report to the Gathering Team and then to the Council. I hope that you will be engaged as we undertake this process together as a body of faith. If you are feeling called to be part of this ad hoc focus group, please contact me very soon. I know you are busy, but this is of vital importance.

Remember, together, we ARE church.
