FOOD FOR THOUGHT....a note from your Pastor <sup>15</sup>See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all. <sup>16</sup>Rejoice always, <sup>17</sup>pray without ceasing, <sup>18</sup>give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. <sup>19</sup>Do not quench the Spirit. <sup>20</sup>Do not despise the words of prophets, <sup>21</sup>but test everything; hold fast to what is good; <sup>22</sup>abstain from every form of evil. 1 Thessalonians 5

What a wondrous time of year; the crisp days and nights, harvest season, the leaves changing, football, deer season, folks busy preparing for the coming winter. There is so very much to be thankful for in our lives. And speaking of being thankful, are you growing in that area of your life? Is it even on your radar?

This month at Immanuel, we are going to be hearing and learning more about the stewardship of our lives. We will hear from families that have committed to tithing and have found joy in doing so. Their stories, and others like theirs, are living proof that when we surrender our resources to God, God can do incredible things. We become more trusting of God because we experience God's faithfulness to us as we let go of the things that we tend to grasp so tightly. Now if you have been brave enough to read to this point, please stay with me for a bit longer.

Why do I associate thankfulness with stewardship you might ask? Because I believe that we are thankful to the level that we understand what God has done and is doing in our lives. Our thankfulness naturally flows to our giving because we realize that everything already belongs to God and we are merely "*stewards*" of what God has given us. Our giving thanks to God is part of our stewardship and our stewardship is part of giving thanks to God. I'm not saying that if you are not tithing, that you are not thankful. Stewardship is our whole lives; time, talent, resources, even the choices we make in purchasing things. But I believe that the deeper our relationship grows with God, the more we develop into thankful people who feel so blessed to be able to tithe and are able to do so with joyful hearts. It is a benchmark, I believe, on our level of trust in God.

So again, how are you growing in the thankfulness department in your life? Do you feel you are more thankful than you were a couple years ago? What steps have you taken to grow? Do you practice thankfulness each day? I believe it is a valuable step to practice this attitude of gratitude in all situations, like Paul says. Giving thanks is not a date on a calendar, but rather it is a way of living into God's kingdom that places the creator at the heart of our lives. It is not a debt to be repaid, but rather an outward sign of an inward joy and desire to deepen that relationship with the divine.

### Serving Team Corner by Den Graeber



God's Work, Our Hands - September 9



### God's Work Our Hands 2018 Summary

Immanuel Lutheran Church held the 2018 God's Work Our Hands Sunday on September 9, 2018. Worship was held at 10 am, with a luncheon for everyone following worship. We had a lovely lunch of pulled pork sandwiches prepared by Shar Saxton and Teresa Barcy. We served about 80 people, with most of them staying to help with the service projects.

**Eaton Siren Shelter** – Eaton Siren Shelter houses individuals or families who are in need of housing and are given any household product that they need. Immanuel collected 290 items for them, including dish soap, laundry soap, batteries, towels, washcloths, bedding, pots & pans, tote bags, trash bags and gift cards.

**Care Packages for College & Military -** Twelve boxes were packed and ready for mailing or hand delivery. The boxes each contained about 32 individually packaged snacks, for a total of 384 items. Greeting cards from the congregation were also included in the packages. There were two large envelopes packaged and filled with cards for two of the young people who could not accept the food snacks.

**Building a Water Well** – We have been collecting loose change to be used to help a third world country build a water well in a region where they have little access to clean and safe drinking water. Our goal is \$2,500 to build the well. As of this date we have about \$ 303.90. This is an ongoing project. We will continue collecting until we reach the goal.

Ken Clark's Coat Closet – The following items were taken over to Ken's Closet by the many members who went over there for an Open House to see how the organization is set up to serve the community. The Director, Sarah Mida, also addressed the congregation during worship by giving a little information about what they do. She explained that they provide clothing for anyone, any age, in the community who needs something. Immanuel gave many packages of new underwear and socks for all ages in addition to gently used clothing, for a total of 277 items. **School Personal Care Items** – These will be delivered to Grand Ledge School District to be distributed to students as the need arises. The 1072 items donated include toothpaste, toothbrushes, washcloths, lotion, deodorant, Chapstick, pillowcases, mouthwash, soap, feminine hygiene products, hairbrushes and hair ties.

**Totals - f**or all projects, there were 1,356 items donated from Immanuel.

We want to thank those Thrivent members who applied for Thrivent Action Dollars which gave us "seed money" to get started on each project and to fill in the gaps where there was a shortage of certain donations. A big THANK YOU goes out to the congregation for their generous gifts of donations to the various charities and to make a difference in the lives of many. We thank those who donated, as well as those who sorted, counted and packaged items to be delivered. 
