FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a note from Your Pastor

1 Therefore I, the prisoner of the Lord, implore you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called, 2 with all humility and gentleness, with patience, showing tolerance for one another in love, 3 being diligent to preserve the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Ephesians 4

As I write this newsletter, the country is reeling from yet another mass shooting. So difficult to put my thoughts and feelings into words, so forgive me if I stop and falter in my writing. Let me start off by saying I am an avid gun owner. I like looking at guns, shooting guns, collecting them, seeing other's collections and hunting. I also understand the intent of the second amendment to the constitution which gives citizens the right to bear arms. I believe in that amendment and the purpose for which it was written.

However, I do not believe, that as a nation, we can continue to journey in this same path of gun laws and regulations and expect different results. We have already become somewhat immune to the shock and horror of horrific mass shooting events because they keep on happening and on a regular basis. But if it were to happen to us! How would we truly feel then? I believe it is time for us to stop touting about "my rights" and "my personal freedoms," and seek to place ourselves in the shoes of those parents and families that lost loved ones in the most recent mass shootings. How would we feel if it happened in Grand Ledge and it affected our families? Would we be able to deal with the sorrow of losing a child, a family member to gun violence?

For those who would say that this article is "too political" and pastor should not be writing about political stuff, I give you my response ahead of time. Two things; first, it seems EVERYTHING is political nowadays and if what I say doesn't ruffle somebody's feathers it is bound to be trite and insignificant to our spiritual life. My calling is as the spiritual leader of this congregation. Secondly, everything is spiritual! When someone is either so desperate or mentally ill enough to pick up a weapon and take the lives of others, it is a spiritual problem. I believe all of our social issues eventually boil down to spiritual issues. It is not that we don't pray hard enough or read the Bible enough. It is that we have lost touch with the heart of the Gospel which is Jesus Christ. When we study his teachings, his way, his humility, his love, we are given an example of how to live this human life. When we focus on a spiritual solution to issues, this means we turn first to the example of God in Christ, not relying first on our own human understanding, but seeking God's will and design.

We are called to let our concerns, the things that matter to US the most, to be the same things that matter to God the most. I'm not asking you to be EXACTLY like Christ, but to be "little Christs" as Martin Luther put it. Or as Paul put it, "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. 5Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus." (Phillipians)

What I am trying to say in all this is well wishing and prayers and hoping for things to get better is all well and fine. However, when we see things are not getting better, it is time to put on that mind of Christ and spring into action. It is us, not someone else who can be the change in the world that we wish to see, but it will start with us putting down our prejudices and tightly held beliefs in order to empathize with those in the midst of the chaos that we have created. I want peace, but it needs to begin with me. May God abide with all those that are grieving and may God grant us the strength to get involved in bringing about change in the land.
