FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a note from Your Pastor

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." ~ Matthew 11:28-30

I have sensed a weariness in our world and in my own life in the last few months. Part of it seems to be all the events that have occurred in our world lately. Certainly, my father's recent passing has added to what I am feeling. It's as if I am sailing without a foresail and things are just not right. I'm moving, yes, and I am heading in the general direction I want to go. But it doesn't feel like it should. There is something deeply off.

I wonder if you have ever felt that or are feeling it these days? Grief is one of the words we humans use to describe these feelings we might be having. But in that tiny little word is wrapped up so much more than something than can be explained in twelve steps. There are memories, hopes, awakenings, melancholy and sadness just to name a few. Grief or the side effects of it are hard to pin down and sneak up at times and in ways that we cannot possibly predict. Grief is by no means convenient. It follows no time-table and at times can seem to be running the show.

But there is something we can try that really is able to help. That is turning our burdens over to God. Giving God the grief and weariness that threatens to overwhelm us. Letting go and letting God

And I pray that you sense the love of God abiding with you and the peace that passes all understanding surrounding you. You, yes you, are a child of God and you are God's beloved. Rest in that awhile.

Our June Noisy Offering for the Grand Ledge Food Bank was \$128.00. Thanks!

Our July 10 noisy offering will be for Stony Lake Lutheran Camp. Stony Lake is trying to send all campers for free this summer. The church council has decided this special noisy offering would be matched. Let's help out this great camping experience!

We would like to remind everyone that the Grand Ledge Food Bank continues to serve the community. If you know of anyone in the Grand Ledge School District that needs assistance with food or clothing call the food bank at (517) 627-4348. Volunteers are available at the food bank on Tuesdays from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The food bank is also in need of plastic grocery bags, if you have extras just drop them of in the grocery cart in the church lobby. If you would like to make a food donation you may just drop your donation off in the cart in the church lobby. Thanks!

The Grand Ledge Island Art Fair is scheduled for Saturday, August 6 from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Our church parking lot will be used again this year and a shuttle bus will take our guests to the island. The Serving Team is planning to extend a little hospitality and will help oversee the shuttle bus transportation to the island.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace Bed Build: The build is scheduled for Saturday, October 1. This year one of our major projects as a part of Immanuel's response to "Gods Work Our Hands" is a bed build for Sleep in Heavenly Peace. In the past we have sent donations of bedding and funds to this national organization whose motto is "no kid sleeps on the floor in our town."

The bed build is scheduled for Saturday, October 1 with registration beginning at 8:30 am and the build likely ending at approximately 12:15 p.m. We will be providing lunch, sodas and cold water. We need 40 volunteers for the build and have extended

an invitation to some local churches to make this more of a community event. The build will be on the church property come rain or shine as SHP provides tents. A sign up sheet for Immanuel volunteers is on the table in the narthex. A variety of skill levels are welcome from operating power tools to staining beds. We will be gathering up volunteer signatures over the summer.

As we plan for the build we will be taking donations for this project until the build. In order to build 15 beds we are going to need donations totaling \$3750.00. We are encouraging everyone to consider what you can donate and use the designated special offering envelope in your envelope packet or special envelopes available on the table in the narthex. In my "career" life, I worked with deadlines on a daily basis. Often the deadline would change and then the project became an emergency. I was fortunate to have a group of coworkers willing to jump in and help, and one woman, when I would thank her for her help, would always say, "Many hands make light work."

We are blessed to have "many hands" at Immanuel helping to keep our church home maintained and serving the needs of our "family". We are in need of more hands please.

Communion is a sacrament that we, as Lutherans, hold dear. To assure that communion goes smoothly every week, it takes a person willing to set up the wine trays and prepare the altar, usually the day before. It takes a person to serve and to clean up after service. Each of those tasks, take less than 30 minutes a week. Currently, we have two members volunteering their time to. Ideally, we would like to have 4 or more so each volunteer would serve one Sunday a month. Please consider giving a minimal amount of time once a month to bless your church family with your service.

Someone sent the following prayer to me years ago. I keep it and read it from time to time to remind myself of the responsibility I have to God, to my faith walk and to others in need. I hope it touches your heart the way it has touched mine.

"You asked for my hands that you might use them for your purpose. I gave them for a moment, then withdrew them, for the work was hard.

You asked for my mouth to speak out against injustice, I gave you a whisper that I might not be accused.

You asked for my eyes to see the pain of poverty. I closed them for I did not want to see.

You asked for my life that you might work through me. I gave a small part that I might not get involved.

Lord, forgive my calculated effort to serve you only when it is convenient for me to do so, only in those places where it is safe to do so, and only with those who make it easy to do so. Forgive me, renew me, send me out as a useable instrument, that I might take seriously the meaning of your cross."

Thank you for taking the time to consider and pray about what you can do to enhance your commitment to God and to Immanuel. Helping with communion is only one area where help is needed.
