FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a note from Your Pastor

35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. Romans 8

If you have ever gone through hardship and loss, and who hasn't, this passage (a snippet of the whole) can be a steady reminder that God's love in Christ is a constant and never-failing foundation. As we pray for those in Florida and Cuba and elsewhere who recently experienced (and are still cleaning up from) one of the worst hurricanes ever, we can convey a sense of hope in the midst of loss and destruction that in spite of what the news stations show, that God is present and at work in the recovery and rebuilding of towns, cities and lives.

That is what hope means. For in another passage. Paul writes about hope as something that is "not yet seen," but the faith of the ones hoping is that the creator will bring to fruition what has been promised. I think Paul rightly says, "who hopes for that which is already seen?" Because we understand hope in God and God's promises to be that which carries us through these hard times but it may not yet have been fully realized. We are not defeated by these dangers, yes, driven to the brink, as close to the edge of no return as we can be, but not beyond the redemption of Christ's love. Through Jesus' redemption, sacrifice and love, we have won a victory, that rescues us from complete and total despair.

So, our hope does not rest in that we will avoid the dangers and hardships that this world will bring, but that the seed of hope

which has been planted in us by the power of the Holy Spirit will take root and bear fruit in our lives. This is what God's love can do. When we are in the middle of crisis, or we know someone who is or we see it on TV, we can take heart in our fervent prayer. God, let your love and mercy be revealed in these lives and be reflected in how I am in the world, until the whole world hears of this hope which cannot be extinguished. May hope abound in the most difficult times and may we be allowed to be ambassadors of that hope that is found in Jesus Christ.

Trusting that God is calling all of us to something greater than we can imagine or understand, we press on in hope and faith that God is indeed making all things new and beautiful and God's timing is perfect. To God be all the glory!

"This timely and timeless book is hilarious, insightful, aggravating, and comforting in equal measure."


This book tackles modern-day racism with the perfect balance of levity and gravity.

Thanks to everyone for your generous response as we gathered up new twin size bedding donations for **Sleep in Heavenly Peace.** What a great response! Also thanks to Thrivent for the Community Impact Card of \$250.00. Together we donated: 21 pillows, 18 sets of sheets, 22 mattress pads, 7 comforter sets, 4 blankets and 9 throws. In addition, we collected 17 gallons of vinegar and 2 packages of steel wool used to finish the beds. Nice Job!

Thanks to everyone who contributed to the **9/11 Remembrance Event**. Thanks to the adult choir and Jacob Hoskins who played TAPS. Also thanks to Dan Landry and the scouts for the color guard. Thanks to Pr. Chuck for his message and prayers. We invited the Grand Ledge Fire and Police Departments however they got called out on an emergency just prior to the event and called to apologize for not being able to attend.

Looking Ahead to November: Immanuel (along with other local churches) received a letter from the Grand Ledge Emergency Assistance Program (GLEAP). The letter thanked Immanuel for our continued support. They also shared that the increase in paying for necessities, gas, food and most retail items has increased and their funding has decreased causing concern. We decided that Immanuel respond with a donation to assist this ministry. Look for special envelopes for this during the period of November 6 through November 20. Watch for more details!

Looking Ahead to December: Immanuel will be participating in our Baskets of Hope ministry that reaches out into the community by providing Christmas Baskets to individuals and families in need. TO VIEW ONLINE: Go to https://members.instantchurchdirectory.com/

You will be asked to enter your email address as it's listed in our directory. If your email address isn't listed in the directory, email your address to directory@immanuel-gl.org or call the church office at 517-627-6310 so it can be added. We will update that information, then once you enter your email at the above address, follow the direction on-screen to complete the log-in process. After you sign in, you'll see the most up-to-date directory for our church. Any time updates are made (they can be done as soon as we receive any changes/ additions), they will show on the Online Members' Website, too.

TO VIEW ON APP:

Download the FREE mobile app available for download at the Apple App Store in iTunes, Google Play store and the Amazon Fire App Store. Simply search for "Instant Church Directory" to get the download. Follow directions to create your own private and safe login and password.
