2022 Report

The Serving Team coordinated the plans for Immanuel's response to God's Work Our Hands. As a congregation we reached out to Sleep in Heavenly Peace which is a national organization with a satellite office in Lansing that makes beds for children. Their motto is "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town." We started by taking donations for the October 1 bed build over the summer with a goal of raising \$3,750.00. By the end of August \$4,390.00 had been raised. What a great response!

We also took bedding donations for the twin size beds for 6-8 weeks and had a great response from the congregation. In addition, Thrivent Action Dollars (\$250.00) were used for this project and with all of the donations from the

congregation the following items were donated:

20 pillows

18 sets of sheets

22 mattress pads

7 comforter sets

4 blankets

9 throws

2 packages of steel wool and

17 gallons of vinegar used for a finish for the beds.



The bed build was held on Saturday, October 1. We reached out to local churches and two churches responded with additional volunteers, the First Congregational United Church of Christ and the Wacousta Community United Methodist Church. At one point during the bed build we probably had 85 volunteers actively participating in the assembly line production of the beds. Apparently we set a record by making 43 twin size beds in 2 ½ hours. It was great to meet and work with volunteers from the Grand Ledge community. Together we were able to reach out into the community doing "God's Work with our hands."

We also learned from the Sleep in Heavenly Peace staff that our bed build resulted in the Lansing Chapter this year exceeding over 500 beds. What a response to this community outreach ministry!

Thanks for your generous donations and for volunteering for this year's event. Together we made a difference!

NEWS FROM the SERVING TEAM

Our October noisy offering for Blessings in a Backpack was \$33.69. Our November 13 noisy offering will be for the Lutheran Disaster Response which is currently responding to the recent hurricanes.



The Grand Ledge Emergency Assistance Program (GLEAP) is in need of some additional support: Immanuel along with other local churches recently received a letter from the GLEAP board. The letter thanked Immanuel for our continued support. Also the letter shared that the increase in paying for necessities, gas, food and most retail items has resulted in a need for more assistance in the community. GLEAP typically helps with food, prescriptions, medical needs, utilities, gasoline, and housing assistance for families in need in the Grand Ledge area. Special giving envelopes are available in the pews and on the table in the narthex. You may also use your regular offering envelopes and designate giving to GLEAP. Donations

for this community outreach ministry will be taken up during the period of November 6-20 with a plan to make our donation from Immanuel asap.

Each year Immanuel has an opportunity to reach out into the community by providing Christmas Gift Baskets to individuals and families in need. We have called this **Baskets of Hope** for many years. We receive the names of those individuals and families through the Grand Ledge Emergency Assistance Program (GLEAP). Because of your generous donations last year to this community outreach project it will not be necessary to donate funds to this ministry. However, it will be necessary to recruit volunteers to shop for these families in December or we may be providing a Meijer gift

card to the families. The Serving Team has decided we should be able to assist 10 families and at this time we are in need of 7 more volunteers to shop for these families. Please consider shopping for these baskets and contact Jean Folk if interested at 517-667-0383. The baskets usually consist of food and small gifts especially for the children. The plan is that the contacts will be provided to us by December 6 with hopes of the volunteers delivering the baskets to these individuals or families by December 21. Thanks!
