FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a note from Your Pastor

The word **Advent** means coming or arrival. The very word hints at a hopeful, expectant anticipation. It is a time of waiting, but it is an active waiting. Therefore, we can also refer to it as a journey, a journey **home.** Echoing the traveling that Mary and Joseph must undergo in order to get to Bethlehem, Advent is a time of transition, a time of change, a time of learning how to hope again. As we celebrate this Advent, we too are on a journey of sorts. It is a journey of our hearts; a part of our faith walk to discern how the Good News will transform our lives. And just like any journey, there will be smooth and bumpy roads, folks along the way and signs that we are headed in the right direction.

A Savior had been promised to God's people for centuries. They longed and prayed for rescue. They hoped beyond hope that the Messiah would come. And then on the right day, in the right place, at the right time, Jesus was born.

All of us are waiting on something, many of us in times of transition. Sometimes we might wonder if God has forgotten us. Just because God hasn't come through (as far as you can see), it doesn't mean He has abandoned you. This very minute, His plan for our lives is working for his glory and our good. Though circumstances

Our November noisy offering for the **Lutheran Disaster Response** was \$47.23. Our December 11th noisy offering will be for the **Grand Ledge Food Bank**. Thanks for your support throughout the year to the noisy offerings as we reach out to these ministries.
