KEN'S COAT CLOSET a.k.a THE 501 BUILDING

Did you know? The building directly to the North of our building is owned by Immanuel. This is known to the congregation as the 501 Building (its street address.) The congregation purchased it in July 2000. The open area between the church and the 501 building used to have a house on it which was used as a parsonage. After the purchase, the congregation organized many work parties to paint, renovate , roof, etc., to get the building usel. It was then used for several years as the congregational offices. The offices eventually moved, but then when Pastor Chuck was called he used the residence until he bought his own house. Then it sat vacant for a period of time with many discussions about how it could be used.

Enter Ken's Coat Closet. This ministry has been serving the Grand Ledge community for many years. Their mission is two fold:

- 1. Providing free clothing, personal care items, and other items to the G.L. community and
- 2. Provide a work based learning environment for special education students.

When Ken's Coat Closet was told by their current building in 2018 that they needed to move, we contacted them to see if the 501 Building would fulfill their needs, which it did. They moved in that summer. They do not pay us any rent but do cover the cost of their utilities. They provide a wonderful service to the community and our congregation is extremely pleased that the building is used for this purpose.

Serving on Sundays

There is a sign-up sheet in the Narthex for volunteers on Sunday mornings. There are many ways to contribute, including space for ushers, inside and outside, lay readers, communion helpers, greeters and coffee fellowship. You can volunteer occasionally or regularly. We are looking for communion servers in January!

Worship is a huge part of our life together, so, please consider how you can be connected to the life of this body of faith. You are welcome and appreciated!
