FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a note from Your Pastor

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 1 Corinthians 12

As we look at this body of faith, we cannot help but see the working of the Holy Spirit. All around us ministry is happening and more of it happening as we move forward. Ministries that were dormant, now coming back to life, and many folks interested in being a part of those ministries. Community Meals, Congregational Caring, Youth Leaders, Easter Breakfast, folks signing up for worship assistants, communion helpers! The list goes on. Some of these ministries may look different than before, but things change, and as we are able to change with them, we are able to grow! Connecting Lives to Christ, our Mission Statement, is not just about visitors getting connected to the body, but we ourselves, using the varieties of gifts from the Holy Spirit, participating in ministry in some way shape or form for the common good of the body of Christ and the sake of the Gospel.

Our goal as this body of Christ is to offer an opportunity for folks to use those gifts; Ministry anytime, anywhere, by anyone is the tag line of a book I re-read recently. "The Permission Giving Church" by Bill Easum. As a congregation, we certainly are striving to move toward that model. Easum writes, "A permission giving church makes a commitment to see in people what God sees in them that they haven't seen in themselves, helps them discover it, and then gets out of their way." In other words, a permission giving church does not seek control over ministries, but still holds people accountable to the mission while letting folks engage in ministry as the spirit moves them. This requires trust and mutual respect and a fair bit of being able to let go of the previous model. We need to be able to accept the ideas of others in order that we can grow as a body. We need to

be able to let go of old patterns to have room to embrace innovative ideas. And the result can bear such incredible fruit for the kingdom especially when we can get out of the way of "this is the way we have always done it." It is true those ways may have worked then, and may in part, work now, but in order to involve more people in ministry and mission, we need to be about allowing the spirit to do the spirit's work, rather than having folks conform to our model of how we think things are supposed to be.

This is a very exciting time to be the church! God has something planned for us and I am so looking forward to see that all unfold. I hope that you share that feeling and that the spirit connects you to some ministry to share God's love and message of hope. You have gifts! And you have been called to use those gifts in the name of Jesus of Nazareth till all know of God's grace.

I am renewed in my excitement about what God has in store for all of us, because I know that God is in the habit of making all things new. May God guide and direct our ministries and our way forward and may we grow deeper in our trust that God has something incredible planned out for this body of faith.

Hello Everyone,

Well, we have reached the Easter season which means spring is just around the corner. Spring can also mean a time of rebirth and renewal. We have several exciting ministries coming back to Immanuel. First, a meeting was held after church on Sunday February 26th. We are bringing back the Community Meal on March 13 from 5:00 pm to 6:00 pm. The group is going to bring things back slowly. We need to dip our toes into the water before diving right back into the deep end right away. We have planned only this meal at this point, as we want to see how it goes. This time everyone agreed to break tasks up to make it easier for people to support this ministry; originally everyone believed that the only way that people could participate was for the entire time. This time there will be a group that shows up to set things up and start preparing the meal. Another group will be there to serve the meals to visitors in the Fellowship Hall. Finally, the last group will be there to clean up and take out the trash. Sometimes the tasks may overlap and that's ok, we want to grow the fellowship and allow everyone to get to know each other while working to help our community.

And they want to bring their ministry to Immanuel. This is a true blessing to all of us! I plan on rolling up my sleeves to do whatever I can to help them and make the return a true success. It is such a wonderful thing to have these two gentlemen, who have been led by God, share their passion to continue with something they enjoy doing. This is a very large undertaking and the more hands we have the lighter the workload. I want to send a big thank you to all who are ready to step up and make this a truly wonderful fellowship opportunity for those who make the food, but also for all of us as we partake in this special event.

At the last Council meeting we talked about renewing a third ministry. We will be bringing back "Care for the Congregation". Each council member will have a list of people from the congregation. We are compiling a list of those who we haven't seen for a while we need to reach out to. Also, if you know of any college students or service members who should be on the list let us know. It may sound funny to some, but I have developed some very special friendships and it is my responsibility as a brother to reach out to them.

The last couple of years around Immanuel have been blessed with new church family member and ministries being brought back. It has been very exciting to watch and be a part of. Spring is a lovely reminder of how beautiful change and growth can truly be. I thank you all so much for helping and guiding me over the years.

SIMPLY GIVE PROGRAM WITH MEIJER

Meijer's is a family-owned company with a focus on enriching lives in the communities they serve. The Grand Ledge store is currently in their **Winter Simply Give Campaign** which runs through Saturday, April 1 with the donation for this first quarter of the year going to the Grand Ledge Food Bank. During this campaign, customers can purchase Simply Give donation cards in the store for \$10 or increments of \$10. Double match days will be held on Saturday, March 4 and Saturday, March 25. For every \$10 Simply Give card purchased on these dates Meijer will provide an additional contribution of \$20, bringing the total to \$30



for a single customer purchase. At the end of the campaign the final totals are converted into food only gift cards for the food bank to use to purchase food items to replenish the food bank shelves.
