FOOD FOR THOUGHT...a note from Your Pastor

5Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? 26Look at the birds of the air: They do not sow or reap or gather into barns— and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? 27Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?... Matthew 6

If you have been here at Immanuel for a while, you may notice something that is different from many other congregations. We don't have a "Stewardship Sunday." We don't have a Sunday or a month that is designated as stewardship month where we talk about giving and we don't ask for pledge cards or that sort of thing.

There is a simple reason for that; our stewardship towards God, our gifts of time and talent, our financial resources are not meant to be a once a year or once a season type of thing. Stewardship is a way of living in God's kingdom. It is part and parcel of our faith walk. Stewardship is not primarily about giving our money for the ministry of the church, although that is a key element, but rather stewardship is all about our relationship with God. It is about trusting that God will meet our needs and by tithing or giving an offering, we demonstrate in a very real and tangible way that we have faith that God will care for us just as God cares for all of creation.

It is true that because of several extremely generous gifts that Immanuel finds itself in a strong place financially. However, this has nothing to do with our personal stewardship, because as I said, stewardship is about our relationship with God, not about paying the bills. When we see stewardship in this light, as part of our faith walk, we come to understand that our giving is part of how we live out our

faith, both to our families and to ourselves. Additionally, as we tithe or work towards a tithe or beyond, we begin to see signs that God is indeed caring for us in ways that before we felt were totally related to how much money we had.

Thus, here at Immanuel, we encourage an attitude of 365 Stewardship, living each day in thankfulness and trust that God has a plan for our lives AND our finances. As we grow in this way, we learn to lean on God more and more and we discover that peace that passes all understanding. Stewardship then becomes a way of life; a natural progression of living a life following Jesus and placing our trust in God.

So, as we prepare to enter into Holy Week and the season of Easter, I invite you to lean on God in all things, trust in the Lord and the Lord will provide you with all that is needed. I promise you, you are worth more than many sparrows. Peace be with you!


NEWS FROM SERVING TEAM

Community Connections

I wrote this article for the newsletter last year, and felt it was something worth repeating, along with an update for the fall's Community Book Read.

"I have recently experienced several definitions of 'community.' The one that caught my eye was 'a feeling of fellowship with others as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals.' I would also add, 'Which can lead to action and change for good, in the greater community.'"

Immanuel is an important part of the community of Grand Ledge and other nearby towns, and there are some things coming up where we are called to action for change. One such opportunity will be to donate specific baby items, to be distributed by the Food Bank, with referrals coming from a couple agencies. (Watch for further de-tails in this newsletter)

Another opportunity happens in the fall. It is the annual Community Book Read, which was started by Grand Ledge United but is now part of a reconfigured group of people, looking at ways to continue the work, learning and action towards justice and equity. The books being considered will be read by local ministers, librarians, teachers and others, and then decided upon. When that decision is made, I will share it with you, so you might consider joining us for conversation at that time. We will offer the Zoom option, as it works well for those working or traveling. Stay tuned.

And finally, I will re-share this:"For the well-known and loved Bible passage, Micah 6:8, The Message version of this verse reads: What is God looking for in men and women? It is quite simple: Do what is fair and just to your neighbor, be compassionate in your love for others, and don't take yourself so seriously—take God seriously."

Maundy Thursday, April 6th


Worship on Maundy Thursday, 7pm, will be a fairly simple service with hand washing and communion. Inside worship.
