1 The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.

This is one of the most well-known Bible passages, one of the most quoted psalms out there. But what about those times you don't feel like you are being led besides still waters? What about those times that you don't feel you are lying in some beautiful green pasture? Certainly, there are times when our lives can seem chaotic, out of control and anything but serene like the image describes in psalm 23. When times like these happen, we might forget those words that are meant to comfort and reassure. Like they say, when you are in the midst of the alligators, it is tough to remember your goal was to drain the swamp.

But Psalm 23 is unique in that it not only provides comforting words, it speaks a sure and certain promise from God! It says that these things ARE happening and HAVE happened and are GOING to continue to happen because of God's grace filled love. Even when it seems like you are not in the calm, serene pasture, this is where God is leading us and restoring us. God's goal is to create this peace in which our lives can refocus on the divine and what God has done. A place where we are able to hear and live out the promise of peace in times of trouble, surety in times of danger, grace in times of adversity. All part of God's plan and with Jesus as our shepherd, we will lack for nothing.

One last thing about this passage; in the last line, most translations say, "surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life." However, that word follow, might be better translated as

"pursue." That's right! God's mercy and goodness pursues us. Wherever we go, wherever we wander or stray. God's mercy wins because it is always chasing after us. What a comfort to know we cannot escape God's love and mercy. Praise God.

May you find the peace that passes all understanding, if only in small doses, and be reminded that nothing can separate us from God's love and mercy.



For the past few years, a **Community Book Read** has taken place in October, around the topics of race, equity, diversity and inclusion. I was at a planning meeting last night with members from the Faith Community and school administration, to discuss books that had been suggested, and it was decided that the book we will read and discuss this year is, "Waking Up White," by Debby Irving. The author states, "[This] is the book I wish someone had handed me decades ago. My hope is that by sharing my sometimes cringe-worthy struggle to understand racism and racial tensions, I offer a fresh perspective on bias, stereotypes, manners, and tolerance." This book was also one of three suggested by the Women of the ELCA for "racial justice advocacy."

We will once again hold a discussion via Zoom, at Immanuel. There will be other sites in the community to do inperson discussions, as well. This year there may even be a special gathering of all who are involved, with this book read in the community, to meet one another, and share our experiences.
