News from the Serving Team



The August noisy offering for the Lutheran Disaster Response was \$8.49. The September 10 noisy offering will be for the Grand Ledge Food Bank. Let's make some noise to support this community outreach ministry!

The IV Team (Immanuel Visitation Team) is back in place and ready to reach out to our members that are shut in or for various reasons are not able to get out to worship. IV Team members have had some training to provide communion and prayer when they visit. It is important to contact Pr. Chuck to keep him informed so he can reach out or team members can reach out to keep us connected. Pr. Jim Couser included a commissioning service in the worship service of July 30. Those commissioned to serve include Jean Folk, George and Annette Ryan, Barb and Fred Roush and Jean and Greg Vicary. Thank you for reaching out to visit and offer communion through this ministry.

The Kitchen Update/Remodel Team recently met with the architect to work on final plans for remodeling the existing kitchen and the adjacent room. After a few more details are resolved the team will be close to putting the job out for a bid. ~ Den Graeber, Serving Team Leader

The Serving Team has been coordinating plans for us to respond to **God's Work Our Hands** this year. We have decided on two outreach projects that reach out in to the community:

Sleep in Heavenly Peace: Last year we had a great response from Immanuel for the bed build. This year we are taking donations of new bedding for this national outreach program that builds twin size beds and provides bedding for families in need. The needed bedding includes twin size sheets, pillows, pillow cases, comforters and mattress pads (all new).



School Supplies for Elementary Schools: For this project we are taking donations of school supplies for elementary students in the Grand Ledge School District. The specific needs for this project include: pocket folders, glue sticks, Elmer's glue, yellow #2 pencils, Crayola crayons (24 count), dry erase markers (black), black and white marble composition books, plastic pencil boxes, kids' scissors, construction paper, cap erasers, wide lined notebook paper and colored pencils. These items will be distributed to the various elementary schools for the teachers to use as an extra source of supplies when needed.

We are collecting items for both outreach projects through **Sunday, September 10.** Tables are set up in the church lobby for donations. It's great to see our response to date! Thank You!

Community Connections

A space for a Community of Believers, Movers and Changers

The Community Book Read & Discussion is upon us already, and the community of Grand Ledge will have an opportunity to read the book, "Waking up White" by Debby Irving. Immanuel will be hosting the Wednesday morning 10:30 Zoom discussion, as it gives working folks the opportunity to participate, by using the time as their lunch hour, break, etc. There will be other in-person opportunities as well. The Grand Ledge District Library will be posting that information on their Events page, so if you would rather do this in person, please look at their page.

Many people have asked or are wondering why we are even considering these October reads, as "I don't see any issues in Grand Ledge." Let me share what a local minister shared with facilitators just last month.

"We all know that Grand Ledge strives to be a community that chooses kindness and inclusivity. We are a loving and welcoming community. But, as you know, we continue to have situations where people of color are not fully included and welcomed. For example, a Black teacher at the high school left this year because of the way that parents and people in the community treated her. Most people in Grand Ledge are surprised to hear this because they, themselves, work hard to be inclusive. So our group has chosen Waking up White: And Finding Myself in the Story of Race by Debby Irving. It's a book by a white author who was deeply committed to racial equity and inclusion, but who discovered that there were ways that she accidentally was causing harm. Many of us who read it found that we identified with her struggles and found hope and wisdom in her advice."

The GLU group is planning an event afterwards to bring all the readers together, including high school students, to discuss and plan for what happens next.

There is a sign-up sheet of open Sundays in the narthex.




Women's Bible Study


